## CAP. XXX.

An Act to appropriate a certain sum to enable Her Majesty to remunerate Doctor Thomas Rolph, for his past services as Emigration Agent.

[12th October, 1842.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN :

HEREAS His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Charles Bagot, Preamble. Governor General of this Province, hath, by His Message bearing date the twenty-ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, Message of 29 recommended that a Sum, not exceeding that hereinafter mentioned, be appropriacited. ted to remunerate Doctor Thomas Rolph for his past services as Emigration Agent in the United Kingdom, on behalf of the Government of Canada, and it is expedient to make such appropriation: May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled, "An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada," and it is hereby enacted £555 11s. 1d. by the authority of the same, that from and out of any unappropriated monies Currency apforming part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of this Province, there may be remuneration paid to the said Doctor Thomas Rolph, a Sum not exceeding five hundred and fifty-five pounds eleven shillings and one penny, Currency, as a remuneration for his services aforesaid.
