CAP. CXXVIII.

An Act to divide the County of Rimouski into two Districts for the Registration of Deeds.

[30th May, 1849.]

THEREAS the County of Rimouski is inconveniently large for Registration Preamble. purposes: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That upon from and after the first day of July next after the passing of this Act, the county of Rimouski, shall for all the purposes of the Ordinance and Acts relative to the Registration of Deeds and other Documents affecting real property in Lower Canada, be divided into two Registration Districts, the first of which shall include and consist of the Parishes of Rivière du Loup, St. Arsène, St. George de Kakouna, Isle Verte, St. Eloi and Trois Pistoles, with the Townships of Whitworth and Viger, and the Registry Office of the said Registration District shall be kept in the Parish of St. Jean Baptiste de l'Isle Verte, and a Registrar may beappointed at any time after the passing of this Act for the said Registration District, to enter upon the functions of his office on the said first day of July; and the second Registration District of the said County shall include and consist of all that part of trick the said County not included in the first Registration District, and the Registry Office thereof shall be kept at Rimouski, where that for the whole County is now kept, and the Registrar now appointed for the County shall, without any new appointment, be the Registrar of and for the said second Registration District.
