CAP. II.

An Act to amend and to render permanent as amended the Act for the Management of the Customs.

THEREAS it is expedient to amend and to render permanent as amended the

Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, An Act to provide for the Management of the Customs and of matters relative to the collection of the Provincial Revenue: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower-Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for and notwithstanding any thing in the third section or in any other part of the Act cited in the Preamble to this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant to the Collectors of Customs at the ports of Quebec and Montreal, respectively, such salary not exceeding seven hundred and fifty pounds currency per annum, as to the said Governor in Council shall seem reasonable and necessary; and that the said Act as hereby amended shall be and is hereby made permanent, and shall remain in force until repealed by competent authority; anything therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

CAP. III.

An Act to provide for the free admission into Canada, of certain Articles of the growth or production of the United States of America, on certain conditions therein mentioned.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is desirable to provide for the free admission into Canada of certain Articles of the growth or production of the United States of America mentioned in the Schedule to this Act annexed, whenever similar Articles the growth or production of Canada shall be admitted without duty it to the said States: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That whenever under any law of the United States of America, the Articles enumerated in the Schedule to this Act annexed, being the growth or production of this Province, shall be admitted free of duty into the said United States of America, then similar Articles, being the growth or production of the said United States, shall be admitted into this Province free of duty when imported direct from the said United States.

When certain articles from Canada are admitted duty free in the U.S, similar articles from U.S. shall be admitted free here.
