CAP. CXI.

An Act to extend the period for the Election of Commissioners under the Act for the improvement of the River-du-Chêne.

[24th July, 1850.]

HEREAS the period limited by the Act hereinafter mentioned for the first Preamble. meeting of the proprietors of certain lands, for the election of Commissioners for the purposes of the said Act, had elapsed before the said Act was printed and distributed in the locality interested therein, and it is therefore right to enable the said proprietors to avail themselves of its enactments, by extending the period within which the said meeting may be held: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the period of six months from the date of the passing thereof, limited by the first section of the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled: An Act to provide for the improvement of the River-du-Chêne, in the County of Two Mountains, as that within which the first Meeting of the proprietors of lands in the Parishes mentioned in the said Act, interested in the Canal or Water Course, also therein mentioned, must be held for the election of Commissioners for the purposes of the said Act, shall be and is hereby extended to the period of eighteen months from the passing of this Act; and the said Act shall be construed and have effect as if the period last aforesaid had been mentioned in the first section of the said Act instead of the period therein mentioned and first aforesaid.
