## CAP. CXLI.

An Act to enable the Members of the United Church of England and Ireland in Canada to meet in Synod.

Reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, 19th June, 1856.

The Royal Assent given by Her Majesty in Council on the 6th May, 1857; and Proclamation thereof made by His Excellency Sir EDMUND WALKER HEAD, Baronet, Governor General, in the Canada Gazette of the 28th May, 1857.

HEREAS doubts exist whether the members of the Uni- Preamble. ted Church of England and Ireland in this Province have the power of regulating the affairs of their Church, in matters relating to discipline, and necessary to order and good government, and it is just that such doubts should be removed, in order that they may be permitted to exercise the same rights of self-government that are enjoyed by other religious communities: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

I. The Bishops, Clergy and Laity, members of the United Bishops, Cler-Church of England and Ireland in this Province, may meet in gy and Laity their several Dioceses, which are now, or may be hereafter of the Church constituted in this Province, and in such manner and by such each Diocese and make may meet and proceedings as they shall adopt, frame constitutions and make may meet and regulations for enforcing discipline in the Church, for the ap-pointment, deposition, deprivation, or removal of any person regulations for bearing office therein, of whatever order or degree, any rights of the governthe Crown to the contrary notwithstanding, and for the convenient ment of the and orderly management of the property, affairs and interests in such Dioof the Church in matters relating to and affecting only the said cese. Church, and the officers and members thereof, and not in any manner interfering with the rights, privileges or interests of other religious communities, or of any person or persons not being a member or members of the said United Church of England

Proviso.

England and Ireland; Provided always that such constitutions and regulations shall apply only to the Diocese or Dioceses adopting the same.

They may meet in general assembly by their representatives from each Diocese, and frame a constitution and regulations for the said Church in this Province.

Proviso: they shall impose no tax.

Proviso.

II. The Bishops, Clergy and Laity, members of the United Church of England and Ireland in this Province, may meet in general Assembly within this Province, by such Representatives as shall be determined and declared by them in their several Dioceses; and in such general Assembly frame a Constitution and regulations for the general management and good government of the said Church in this Province; Provided always, that nothing in this Act contained shall authorize the imposition of any rate or tax upon any person or persons whomsoever, whether belonging to the said Church or not, or the infliction of any punishment, fine or penalty upon any person, other than his suspension or removal from an office in the said Church, or exclusion from the meetings or proceedings of the Diocesan or General Synods; And provided also, nothing in the said constitutions or regulations, or any of them, shall be contrary to any Law or Statute now or hereafter in force in this Province.
