4 & 5 Victoria – Chapter 41

An Act to enable persons authorized to practise Physic or Surgery in Upper or Lower Canada, to practise in the Province of Canada. 18th September, 1841.

Whereas it is expedient that persons authorized to practise Physic or Surgery in one portion of this Province, should be authorized to practise in the other portion thereof; Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled *An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that any person who is or shall be duly licensed or authorized to practise as a Physician, or as a Surgeon, or as both, either in that part of the Province called Upper Canada, or in that part of the Province called Lower Canada, under the Laws in force in the said portions of this Province, respectively, shall be and is hereby authorized to practise in any part of this Province, for the purpose or purposes for which he might without this Act have practised in one of the aforesaid portions of this Province; but subject to the Laws to which other Practitioners are or shall be subject in the portion of this Province in which he shall practise.
