4 & 5 Victoria – Chapter 72

An Act to extend the provisions of an Ordinance therein mentioned to a certain Road on the North side of the River St. Charles, in the District of Quebec. 18th September, 1841.

Whereas it is expedient to extend the provisions of the Ordinance of the Legislature of the late Province of Lower Canada, passed in the Fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled *An Ordinance to provide for the improvement of certain Roads in the neighbourhood of and leading to the City of Quebec, and to raise a fund for that purpose*, to the Road hereinafter mentioned; Be it therefore enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled *An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the provisions of the said Ordinance and the powers of the Trustees appointed under the authority thereof, shall extend to the Road leading from that sixthly mentioned in the ninth Section of the said Ordinance, to Scott's Bridge, (including the said Bridge,) and to the main Road running along the North bank of the River St. Charles, from Scott's Bridge, aforesaid, to the Bridge over the said River, commonly called the Red Bridge, or Commissioner's Bridge, (including the said Bridge,) as fully to all intents and purposes whatsoever, as if the said Roads and Bridges had been mentioned and described in the said ninth Section of the said Ordinance as among those to which the said provisions and powers should extend.
