4 & 5 Victoria – Chapter 77

An Act to extend the time limited by Law for the construction and completion of the Port Dover Harbour. 18th September, 1841.

Whereas in and by an Act of the Parliament of Upper Canada, passed in the fifth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, and intituled *An Act to continue and amend an Act passed in the second year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for incorporating a Joint Stock Company under the style and title of the President, Directors and Company of the Port Dover Harbour*, it is among other things in effect enacted that the said Act shall cease and be utterly null and void, unless the Harbour therein mentioned be completed within seven years from the passing of the said Act; And whereas the Harbour hath been commenced and a considerable sum of money expended thereon, and it is expedient to extend the time within which it may be completed so as to prevent the expiration of the said Act; Be it therefore enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled *An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*; and it is hereby enacted, by the authority of the same, that the said Act shall remain in force during seven years from the passing of this Act, after the expiration of which term it shall remain in full force and effect if the said Harbour be then completed, but shall otherwise cease and be thence forward utterly null and void.
