7 Victoria – Chapter 40

An Act to amend the Act relating to the Boundary Line between the Niagara and Gore Districts. 9th December, 1843.

Whereas doubts have arisen as to the true construction of certain parts of the Act of the Legislature of the late Province of Upper Canada, passed in the fifty-sixth year of the Reign of his late Majesty, King George the Third, and intituled, *An Act to grant and form a new District out of certain parts of the Home and Niagara Districts, to be called the District of Gore,* which relate to the Boundary Line between the Districts of Niagara and Gore, and it is expedient to remove such doubts by defining more accurately the said Boundary Line; Be it therefore enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada,* and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the present Division Line between the Townships of Oneida and Seneca, in the District of Niagara, and the Townships of Tuscarora and Onondaga, in the District of Gore, shall form and be a part of the Boundary Line between the said District of Niagara and the said District of Gore; any thing in the Act cited in the Preamble to this Act, to the contrary notwithstanding.
