## An Act to make provision for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government of this Province, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five. (29th March, 1845.)

## MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Whereas it appears by Message from His Excellency the Right Honorable Charles Theophilus, Baron Metcalfe, of Fernhill, in the County of Berks, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, one of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and Governor General of this Province, bearing date the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fortyfive, that the sum hereinafter mentioned will be required to defray certain expenses of the Civil Government for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, for which no provision is made by law: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, "An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and out of any unappropriated monies forming part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of this Province, there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding two hundred and thirty-two thousand nine hundred and twenty-five pounds, fourteen shillings and eight pence currency, to defray certain expenses of the Civil Government of this Province not otherwise provided for by law, for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

II. And be it enacted, That the due application of the monies hereby appropriated shall be accounted for to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, shall direct.

III. And be it enacted, That a detailed account of the monies expended under the authority of this Act shall be laid before the Legislative Assembly of this Province during the first fifteen days of the Session of the Provincial Parliament next after such expenditure.
