12 Victoria – Chapter 89

An Act to alter the day on which the Militia shall annually assemble for Muster and Discipline in Upper Canada. 25th April, 1849.

Whereas the day appointed by the twenty-eighth Section of the Act regulating the Militia, for the Annual Muster of the said Militia, hath been found inconvenient in Upper Canada, and it is expedient to change the day so appointed: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to reunite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted, by the authority of the same, That for and notwithstanding any thing in the twenty-eighth Section or in any other part of the Act passed in the ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, *An Act to repeal certain Laws therein, mentioned, to provide for the better defence of this Province, and to regulate the Militia thereof*, the day on which the first class of Militia shall be assembled in Upper Canada for Muster and Discipline shall not be the twenty-ninth day of June, but shall be the twenty-eighth day of June in each year, unless that day be a Sunday or Holy-day, in which case the next following day not being a Sunday or a Holy-day, shall be the day for so assembling.
