13 & 14 Victoria – Chapter 122

**An Act to amend the Ordinance incorporating The Advocates' Library of Montreal. 24th July,
1850.**

Whereas it is expedient to amend a certain Ordinance of the Governor and Special Council for the Province of Lower Canada, passed in the Fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Ordinance to incorporate the Advocates' Library of Montreal*: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That at any and every meeting of the said Corporation which may be held after the passing of this Act, any ten Members of the said Corporation, present at such meeting, shall form a quorum, and shall be competent to exercise all and every the functions of the said Corporation, whether in the election of Officers or the making of Statutes, By-laws, Rules or Orders concerning the government of the said Corporation, or otherwise, in like manner to all intents and purposes, as the major part of the Members of the said Corporation could have done previous to the passing of this Act.

II. And be it enacted, That every thing in the said Ordinance contained, inconsistent with the foregoing enactment, is hereby repealed.

III. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be held to be a Public Act.
