13 & 14 Victoria – Chapter 94

An Act to appropriate the moneys arising from Duties on Tavern Licenses, in the County and City of Montreal, towards defraying the cost of the new Court House to be erected in the City of Montreal. 10th August, 1850.

Whereas it is necessary to provide more ample funds for defraying the cost of erecting the new Court House at Montreal than are provided by the Act passed in the twelfth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, *An Act to make provision for the erection or repair of Courthouses and Gaols, at certain places in Lower Canada*, under which the said Court House is to be erected: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for and notwithstanding any thing in the Act passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, *An Act to provide for the payment of claims arising out of the Rebellion and Invasion in Upper Canada, and to appropriate the duties on Tavern Licenses to local purposes*, the moneys arising after the passing of this Act, from the Duties on Licenses to keep Houses of Public Entertainment, within the County and City of Montreal, shall be and are hereby appropriated towards defraying the cost of erecting the new Court House in the City of Montreal, under the Act mentioned in the preamble to this Act, and the other expenses incident thereto, and the principal and interest of the Debentures issued or to be issued under the said Act, and the expenses of keeping the said Court House and its appurtenances, in thorough repair and order; and such moneys shall be paid, applied and accounted for accordingly by the proper officers, and no part thereof shall be paid over to the Treasurer of any Municipal Division whatsoever.
