16 Victoria – Chapter 150

An Act to amend an Act passed during the present Session of the Legislature, intituled, *An Act to ascertain and establish the rights of the Co-proprietors of the Common of St. Antoine de la Baie.* Assented to 23rd May, 1853.

Whereas an error hath crept into the sixth section of the Act passed during the present Session of the Legislature, and intituled, *An Act to ascertain and establish the rights of the Coproprietors of the Common of St. Antoine de la Baie*, inasmuch as certain powers are conferred upon and certain duties required to be performed by the Judge of the Circuit Court, in the District of Three-Rivers, whereas there is no such Judge, and it is important for the parties interested that the said error be corrected: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of The Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada,* and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the powers conferred by the said Act upon the Judge of the Circuit Court in the District of Three Rivers, and all the duties required to be performed by such Judge, as well under the sixth section of the Act above cited as under any other section of the said Act, shall be exercised and performed by a Judge of the Superior Court for Lower Canada, but in other respects in the manner provided by the said Act.

II. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
