16 Victoria – Chapter 223

An Act to specify the time when an Act of the present Session, relating to the Townships of Kingston and Pittsburgh, shall come in force. Assented to 14th June, 1853.

Whereas by an Act passed in this present Session, intituled, *An Act to attach a certain portion of the Township of Kingston, in the County of Frontenac, to the Township of Pittsburgh, for Municipal and other purposes*, it is amongst other things in effect provided, that all that portion of the Township of Kingston, in the said County of Frontenac, in the Province of Canada, lying to the east of the channel of the Rideau Canal should, for municipal and all other purposes, be attached to and form part of the Township of Pittsburgh; And whereas the time when the said Act shall come in force is not mentioned therein, and it is desirable that the same should take effect from and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said in part recited Act shall come in force and take effect from and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, and not before.
