16 Victoria – Chapter 231

An Act to repeal an Ordinance therein mentioned, intituled, *An Ordinance for regulating the Markets of the Towns of Quebec and Montreal*, so far as respects the City of Quebec. Assented, to 14th June, 1853.

Whereas it is right and necessary to repeal the Ordinance hereinafter mentioned, in so far as the same affects the City of Quebec: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada,* and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That a certain Ordinance made by the Captain General and Governor in Chief of the late Province of Quebec, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Province, in the seventeenth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled, *An Ordinance for regulating the markets of the Towns of Quebec and Montreal*, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, in so far as the said Act relates to the said City of Quebec.
