16 Victoria – Chapter 53

An Act for the granting of certain Lots in the Town of Bytown to *The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company*. 10th November, 1852.

Whereas lots numbers four, five and six on the west side of Dalhousie street, ten, eleven, twelve and thirteen on the north side of Bolton street, and ten, eleven, twelve and thirteen, on the south side of Boteler street on Lot Letter O, in the Town of Bytown, were reserved by Order of Council for the purpose of a Market site; And whereas the said Lots are unsuitable for that purpose, and the Municipal authorities of the Town of Bytown have made other provision for markets, and have expressed their concurrence in the said Lots being granted to The By town and Prescott Railway Company; And whereas the said Rail-way Company require the said Lots for ground for the Depot at Bytown, and have petitioned for a grant thereof: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, to grant to The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company all and singular the said several Lots or Parcels of land and premises, with the appurtenances, to hold to the said The Bytown and Prescott Rail-way Company, in fee simple for the uses of the said Company.
