16 Victoria – Chapter 98

**An Act to transfer the place of meeting of the Municipal Council of the Municipality of
Drummond, Number Two, to the Village of St. Christophe d'Arthabaska, in the said
Municipality. Assented to 22nd April, 1853.**

Whereas the place of meeting of the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Drummond,
Number Two, was, by an Act passed in the Session held in, the fourteenth and fifteenth years of
Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, *An Act to transfer the place of holding the meetings of the
Municipal Council of the Municipality of Drummond, Number Two, from 'French Village' in the
Township of Kingsey, to the Village of Stanfold in the said Municipality*, fixed at the said village of
Stanfold, and it is expedient, for the general convenience of the population of the said
Municipality, to transfer the place of meeting of the said Municipal Council, to a more central
position; And whereas the village of St. Christophe d'Arthabaska, in the said county of Drummond,
is more central and more conveniently situated for the majority of the inhabitants of the said
Municipality: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of
Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the
Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the
Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and fo- the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby
enacted by the authority of the same, That on, from and after the Tenth day of May next, the
place of meeting of the Municipal Council of the said Municipality, shall be the said village of St.
Christophe d'Arthabaska, instead of the said village of Stanfold.
