18 Victoria – Chapter 71

An Act to extend the time for completing the Louth Harbour. Assented to 3rd April, 1855.

Whereas in and by an Act of the Parliament of Upper Canada, passed in the third year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, and intituled, *An Act to incorporate a Joint Stock Company, for the construction of a Harbour at the mouth of the Twenty Mile Creek, on Lake Ontario*, certain persons therein named, with others who became Stockholders in the said work, immediately after the passing of the Act, proceeded to expend a large sum of money in the erection of Piers at the mouth of the said Creek, sufficient to secure the reception and shelter of such craft as then commonly navigated the Lake; And whereas the said works have not been completed within the time specified in the said Act; And whereas the Charter of the said Company has thereby become null and void, and it is expedient to revive the same, and to extend the time for completing the said works: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, *An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, as follows:

- I. That the said Statute of the late Province of Upper Canada, passed in the third year of the Reign of King William the Fourth, and every thing therein contained reserving the rights, privileges and immunities of the Louth Harbour Company, shall be deemed to have been, and is hereby declared to be revived, and shall continue in force; Provided always that the said works shall be completed within five years from the passing of this Act, otherwise this Act and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease and be utterly null and void.
- II. This Act shall be a Public Act.
