20 Victoria – Chapter 108

An Act to enable the Town Council of the Town of St. Catharines, to sell and convey certain Land purchased by the said Council for the purpose of a Public Cemetery. Assented to 1st July, 1856.

Whereas the Town Council of the Town of St. Catharines, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, purchased a part of Lot number seven in the seventh concession of the Township of Grantham, for the purpose of a Public Cemetery; And whereas the said Council subsequently acquired another tract of land more advantageously situate for the purpose of a Public Cemetery, and has expended a large sum of money in preparing the said last mentioned tract of land for Cemetery purposes; And whereas the said Council no longer requires the said land so purchased as aforesaid, and desires to be authorized to dispose thereof: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. The said Town Council of the Town of St. Catharines shall have full power and authority to sell and dispose of that part of Lot number seven in the seventh concession of the Township of Grantham, in the County of Lincoln, heretofore purchased by the said Council for the purpose of a Public Cemetery, and to convey the same in fee simple to such person or persons as may be desirous of purchasing the same.
- II. This Act shall be a Public Act, and the Interpretation Act shall apply to it.
