20 Victoria – Chapter 38

An Act to vest in John Farley the younger, a certain Allowance for Road, in the Township of Darlington. Assented to 16th May, 1856.

Whereas the allowance for Road between the North halves of lots numbers eighteen and nineteen in the Fifth Concession of the Township of Darlington is not required as a road and would be impassable if opened; And whereas John Farley the younger, of Darlington, Gentleman, has granted a road in lieu thereof, and the municipal Council of Darlington have consented that the said allowance for road should be vested in the said John Farley the younger, in lieu of the road granted by him as aforesaid: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. For and notwithstanding any thing in any Act of the Parliament of Upper Canada or of Canada contained, the road or concession allowance between the North halves of lots numbers eighteen and nineteen in the Fifth Concession of the said Township of Darlington shall be and is hereby vested in the said John Farley the younger, his heirs and assigns forever, and the said road so granted by the said John Farley the younger, is hereby declared a public highway in lieu of the said road or concession allowance.
- II. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
